MÉTHODOLOGIE

The course is divided into six modules covering the following areas: 1)
Introduction, 2) Climate Change, 3) International Waters, 4) Biodiversity, 5) Land
Degradation, 6) Chemicals and Waste. Each module takes an average of 1 hour to
complete.

- Someone curious and interested to learn more about how efforts to address environmental degradation and promote gender equality can be mutually supportive.
